

### Hiram's Tracing Board

Hiram Abif's tracing board is believed to have been made of wood, covered with a coating of wax. Each day he would draw his Master architect's measurements & symbols into the wax in order to instruct his Master Masons of the work that was to be accomplished. At the end of the day, he would simply scrape off the wax and pour a new layer of hot wax onto the board to ready it for the next day's work.

### Masonic Tracing Board

Much later, in the days where lodge was held in secret areas on foothills and valleys, once lodge was in session, the Tiler would draw an oblong image into the dirt that represented the form of the Lodge. Again, onto that tracing board was drawn the architect's plan... the working tools in the degree that was to be worked. If the Brethren were to walk atop the markings made in dirt on the foothills and valleys, the message of that lecture which was being worked could be partially or fully destroyed.

### This Month in Masonic History

**April 4<sup>th</sup>, 1778** - Voltaire was initiated in "Les Neuf Soeurs" Lodge in Paris. His conductors were Benjamin Franklin & Count Geblein.

April 5<sup>th</sup>, 1886 – Rudyard Kipling received his 1rst Degree.

April 21rst, 1821 - The Grand Lode of Missouri was formed.

**April 24<sup>th</sup>, 1901** – President Theodore Roosevelt received his 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree.

## THE NORTHEAST CORNER

### "Bee"

The bee-hive is an important symbol and is depicted as a symbol of industry, hence the work of the Lodge, so that Masons should continue to learn in all stages of life. Bees are able to accomplish large tasks because they cooperate in force, a single bee can do very little. This is in parallel to Masonry, where strength is gained by the active participation of all its members.

The bee is also the emblem of several Greco-Roman and Indian gods, including Cupid and Kama, both gods of love. In Indian culture, a blue bee represents Krishna, a bee on a lotus leaf the God Vishnu, and a bee above a triangle represents Shova. The Egyptians believed that bees were born from the tears of the Sun-god, Ra. Bees are also depicted on many ancient tombs, as symbols of the afterlife and resurrection. This probably came from the fact that bees do not leave their hive during the three month hibernation period, only to reappear later. Some compared this to Christ's resurrection, whereby his body vanished for three days, only to reappear after the resurrection.

Bees have been linked in many ways to the divine. Originally thought to have lived in Paradise, the Welsh tradition goes, they came down to earth to produce wax and honey - the wax to make candles for lights used in altars, and honey to sustain man. For this reason bees were considered lucky. If a bee entered a house, it was considered lucky, whereas in Wales a bee flying around a sleeping child was said foretells a happy life.

Furthermore, bees' honey and sting are also associated with Christ and Judgment Day. In Ireland bees were legally protected, for they produce honey which in turn produces mead, the drink of immortality that flows in the Otherworld. In Christian allegory a queen bee sometimes represents the Virgin Mary, the hive symbolizing the Church. The coat of arms of Pope Urban VIII and Napoleon I, for example, depicts several bees. – Author, Unknown
