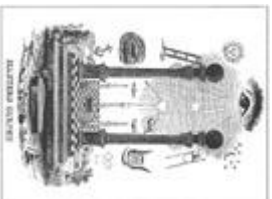

Lodge Office Spotlight of the Month

The Color: Blue

The symbolism and meaning of the color “Blue” stands for the vertical and the spatial, or in retrospect height and depth or the blue sky above, the blue sea below. It symbolizes that Masonry is as wide as these dimensions. Blue is also considered to be “between black & white”, also commonly identified with two opposing forces, good & evil. Thus blue is considered the most neutral of all colors. As Masons, we are equal in our position with other members, regardless of color, rank, title or any other status and it is very appropriate that blue represents this equality. We can say that this world is the neutral area, and we seek a deeper world, for the higher you go in the blue heaven, the darker the blue sky becomes. In the same way, the deeper you go in the blue ocean, the darker it becomes.

Blue is also considered the color for the spirit, intellect, devotion and innocence.

Dave Thomas was an American businessman and founder of the Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption, to realize his dream of a home for every child. He was born in Atlantic City and adopted at 6 weeks. As founder of Wendy's Old Fashioned Hamburgers restaurant chain, his appearance as spokesperson have made their advertising campaign the longest running in history. He appeared in more than 800 commercial advertisements for the chain from 1989 to 2002, more than any other company founder in television history...
