## **Spotlight on a Brother**

We sat down with Brother Gerry Dobson for a few minutes and he shared with us his thoughts on being a Mason.

Gerry (Gerard) was raised a Master Mason in 1956 in Cloud Lodge in New Jersey. He had been initiated as an Entered

Apprentice in Sarasota Lodge No. 147 in Florida the previous year, but had taken a teaching job in Pennsylvania which led to his attending lodge in Gloucester, New Jersey. After moving to Texas, he joined Justin Lodge, and later he joined Lewisville Lodge in 2005.

Gerry has served as the Lodge Historian and takes the position with a seriousness that underscores his passion for history. Many of us have had the pleasure of hearing Gerry's presentations on Masonic History during the Stated Meetings. He has done extensive research on our lodge, going back to the early years where he has written about the first generation of Worshipful Masters of Lewisville Lodge following the civil war.

Gerry is a graduate of Florida Southern and began his journey in academia teaching math and algebra for 3 years. After returning to graduate school at Florida State, where he received his PhD in Organic Chemistry in 1962, he served as an Associate Professor at the University of

Georgia and later at the University of South Dakota.

The realization that he now had a family to support, or as only Gerry can describe the revelation as "Scales falling from my eyes", he took a job at the University of North Texas.

He began teaching at the University of North Texas in 1969, where he was a professor of Chemistry for 30 years. One of his accomplishments at UNT was being named "Regents Professor of Chemistry".

Gerry married his wife Kay in 1962. He has three children and eight grandchildren (7 girls and 1 boy).

A native New Yorker, he moved with his family to Florida in 1950 because "there were too many laws" in New York according to Gerry.

A couple of the more memorable Masonic experiences for Gerry were his initiation as an Entered Apprentice Mason, and receiving his 25 year Service Award at Justin Lodge.

His hobbies and past times include: genealogy, traveling,

and writing. He enjoys researching what he calls “micro history” or the “lives of the ordinary”.

Gerry took a sabbatical from UNT in 1986 to live in England for six months.

You may find Gerry in the Lodge Library working on his next presentation or doing research on a Mason from Italy or South America. Take a few minutes to chat with him—a time well spent!
