

May 3rd, 1886 – Rudyard Kipling received his 2nd Degree.

May 17th, 1959 – High Twelve International was organized.

May 31rst, 1801 - The Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite for the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States, "mother council of the world," was established, in Charleston, South Carolina.

Brother Audie Leon Murphy (June 20th, 1924 – May 28th, 1971)

Audie Murphy was the most decorated US combat soldiers of WWII. After the war, he moved to Hollywood; his first starring role came in 1949 released film called "Bad Boy". He went on to star in 44 feature films over the next 25 years. His 1949 autobiography "To Hell and Back" was a best seller. Murphy starred as himself in the 1955 film version which held the record as Universal's highest grossing picture until 1975 when it was finally surpassed by "Jaws".

He was also a successful thoroughbred and quarter-horse owner and breeder, having interests in such great horses as "Depth Charge". Murphy wrote some poetry and was quite successful as a songwriter.

In an effort to draw attention to the problems of returning Korean & Vietnam War veterans, Murphy spoke out candidly about his personal problems with PTS (Post Traumatic Stress), then known as "Battle Fatigue".
