

THE NORTHEAST CORNER

Samuel Langhorne Clemens

(November 30th, 1835 – April 21rst, 1910)

Better known by his pen name, Mark Twain was an American author, humorist and was most noted for his novels. He achieved great success as a writer and public speaker. His wit and satire earned praise from critics & peers. He wrote novels like "The Adventures of Tom Sawyer" (1876), & its sequel which is often called "the Great American Novel", the "Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" (1885).

Twain grew up in Hannibal, Missouri, which would later provide the setting of the two novels mentioned above. He was a failure at gold mining, so he turned to journalism. He started out as a printer and typesetter in various cities. While traveling, he mastered being a Riverboat pilot on the Mississippi River before heading west to join

his older brothers newspaper, *The Orion*, and contributed articles which included a humorous story, "*The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County*." Twain found his calling and these kinds of stories which included his travelogues brought him nationwide attention and were well received.

He lacked financial acumen, though he made a great deal of money from all of his writings, novels and lectures. He squandered most of his money on various ventures, one in particular, The Paige Compositor, and was forced to declare bankruptcy. In later years, he eventually overcame his financial troubles and worked hard to ensure all of his creditors were paid in full, even though his bankruptcy had relieved him of the legal responsibly.

Twain was born by a visit by Halley's Comet and he predicted that he would "go out with it" as well. He died the day following the comet's subsequent return. He was lauded as the "Greatest Humorist" of his age and William Faulkner once said he was "the Father of American Literature".

One of Twain's comical quotes:

"If you hold a cat by the tail, you learn things you cannot learn any other way..."

Twain's Freemason's information:

St. Louis, MO Polar Star Lodge No. 79 A.F. & A.M.

EA – May 22, 1861, FC – June 12th, 1861, MM – July 10th, 1861In

In 1868, after a renowned trip abroad which inspired a book called, "Innocent's Abroad", Brother Clemens returned to his lodge to present a gift, a gavel (still a prize possession of his Lodge) to his Worshipful Master at his Polar Star Lodge No. 79. The words inscribed on the metal band scrolled around the handle, "This mallet is of Cedar, cut in the Forest of Lebanon whence Solomon obtained the Timbers for the Temple. This handle was cut by Brother Clemens himself from a cedar planted just outside the walls of Jerusalem where Bro. Godfrey DeBoullion, the first Christian conqueror of that city 19th of July, 1099. The gavel in its present form was made at Alexandria, Egypt by order of Bro. Clemens."

"Tools and implements of architecture, symbols most expressive, have been selected by the Fraternity to imprint on the memory wise and serious truths; and thus through a succession of ages, are transmitted, unimpaired, the most excellent tenets of our institution."
